CASE OF THE MONTH

COVID-19 Takings Lawsuit Filed in California

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First reported by our good friends inversecondemnation.com, lawsuit has been filed in California alleging that the response by state and county agencies to the COVID-19 situation violates the state and federal Constitutions, and results in a partial or complete taking in violation of the Fifth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. The named defendants include Governor Newsom, Attorney General Xavier Becerra, the State Public Health Officer, county Public Health Officers, and county representatives throughout Southern California. The complaint alleges:

- The "stay at home and shut down" orders unlawfully interfere with the federal constitutional right to travel;
- The orders violate plaintiffs' substantive due process rights, because they deprive plaintiffs of their rights and liberties in lawfully operating their businesses;
- The orders violate plaintiffs' procedural due process rights, because they were not provided with a constitutionally adequate hearing to present their case before being shut down;
- The orders violate the equal protection clause because they intentionally and arbitrarily categorize California businesses as "essential" or "non-essential,"


and require those categorized as "non-essential" to shut down;

- The orders and enforcement thereof have caused both a complete and total regulatory and physical taking of plaintiffs' property, or at least a partial taking without just compensation in violation of the Fifth Amendment's takings clause;
- The orders violate plaintiffs' right to liberty as guaranteed by the California Constitution; and
- The orders by Governor Newsom have commandeered plaintiffs' "non-essential" businesses, requiring compensation under California Government Code section 8572.

The lawsuit was filed in the United State District Court for the Central District of California. (Click here if you want to read about some of the significant hurdles associated with pursuing a takings claim based on government mandates surrounding COVID-19.) Given the breadth of the claims and the impact COVID-19 has had on the federal courts, it will be interesting to see how quickly this case moves forward, and the State's response to being sued in federal court. Generally, the State or an arm of the State cannot be sued in federal court unless there is an express waiver of sovereign immunity or the plaintiff is simply pursuing injunctive relief (the Ex Parte Young exception to sovereign immunity). In this case, no express waiver of sovereign immunity is alleged, and while the Ex Parte Young exception could potentially be invoked with respect to many of plaintiffs' claims, the courts have almost uniformly held that the Ex Parte Young exception does not apply to takings claims

It is possible that the plaintiffs intend to rely on the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Knick v. Township of Scott (2019) 139 S.Ct. 2162 to argue that sovereign immunity is no longer a viable defense to a Fifth Amendment takings claim against the State. (Click here to see our prior discussion of Knick.) In Knick the Supreme Court held that a property owner can bring a Fifth Amendment takings claim in federal court without first having to exhaust state judicial remedies. However, Knick did not contain any discussion of eliminating a state's sovereign immunity, and at least two courts have expressly held that Knick did nothing to abrogate a state's sovereign immunity in the takings context. (See Williams v. Utah Dep't of Corrections (10th Cir. July 8, 2019) F.3d 1209; Bear Crest Ltd. LLC v. Idaho (D. Idaho July 17, 2019) 2019 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 120404.)

Professionalism At All Times

All of a sudden, I was hit with these tech tools that I'd never heard of before and at first became overwhelmed, but learned to adapt and adjust successfully, yes! It's really amazing how far we've advanced in today's tech world!

Anyway, going forward I'm really confident that we'll all rise from this situation and learn about adaptability even more. That said, let's keep striving forward and keep our credentials, accomplishments, and motivations focused by keeping up with our professions.

The SR/WA aka "Senior Right of Way Agent" is "Right of Way's" highest designation recognized by all those who engage in right of way or real estate related acquisition projects for agencies or quasi-public agencies. The SR/WA provides an individual with a relatively strengthened breadth of knowledge and experience in the field of right of way and displays the initiative we have for education and hands-on experience.

In order to work toward an IRWA designation, the following is a brief look at the steps:

- a) Right of Way Agent (RWA): This is the novice level where one works toward and completes the equivalent of 64 classroom or online credit units of coursework.
- b) Right of Way Professional (RWP): This is the intermediate level where one works toward and completes the equivalent of 144 classroom or online credit units of coursework. It is the additional coursework beyond the 64 credits already completed from the RWA certification.
- c) Senior Right of Way Professional (SR/WA): This is the advanced level where one works toward and completes a cumulative total of 208 classroom or online credit units.

Please note, there is also an equivalent amount of work experience in right of way and an 8-hour ethics course required at each credentialing level.

As we navigate the remainder of the year and forward, let's maintain our strides to keep up our integrity, professionalism and persistence throughout. The White House

 Transportation Secretary Chao announced over \$900 million in INFRA grants for 20 projects across the country on Thursday. The INFRA grant program was created in the FAST Act and provides funding for large highway and freight projects. https://www.transportation.gov/briefing-room/us-secretary-transportation-elaine-l-chaoannounces-906-million-investment-revitalize

Congress

- Both Chambers are in session this week.
- The Transportation and Infrastructure ("T&I") Committee marked-up its surface transportation reauthorization legislation—the INVEST in America Act—on Wednesday and Thursday, considering hundreds of amendments and adopting 57 of them. <a href="https://transportation.house.gov/news/press-releases/after-marathon-markup-committeeadvances-the-invest-in-america-act-a-transformational-surface-transportation-bill-tomove-nations-infrastructure-into-new-era
- Speaker Pelosi announced that the House would consider a \$1.5 trillion infrastructure bill prior to July 4th. The INVEST in America Act would be the largest component of the legislation, which would also include funding for drinking water, broadband, energy, school, and other infrastructure classes. The announcement did not specify how the House intended to pay for the spending proposed in the legislation. https://thehill.com/homenews/house/503427-democrats-unveil-15-trillion-infrastructureplan

<u>Analysis</u>

- The big item to watch over the next two weeks will be what the House decides to do regarding pay-fors for the \$1.5 trillion infrastructure legislation. The House could continue trying to work with the Administration on a viable set of pay-fors, but no details have emerged from the months of conversations that House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Neal has been having with Treasury Secretary Mnuchin on the issue. Another alternative is for the House to vote to deficit spend and punt on the offset issue. This would be in keeping with the approach taken in the COVID-relief legislation, IRWA Weekly Update but would essentially admit that no agreement is to be found with the Administration on funding options.
- The other item to watch will be the message coming from the Senate as the House moves forward with this legislation.
 Senate Majority Leader McConnell has said that the Senate will consider infrastructure legislation this summer, but has not yet scheduled Floor time. The Senate has not yet unveiled how it intends to pay for any such infrastructure legislation.






